History of the College

*LOKEPARA MAHAVIDYALAYA is a located in the remote village of Bajarhat, under Dheka Gram Panchayet, Mayureswar II. The Mahavidyaalaya was established in 2010. The first edifice was set up in the then Lokepara football ground by the Headmaster of Lokepara High School, Dr. Nabakishore Hazara. The well-wishers and progressive minded people of the locality raised a fund named as 'College's money' through extensive door to door collection from the locals. The locals to contribute 8 acres of land for establishment of the college without any expectation or pecuniary rewards for the said contribution. After a long struggle, in 2008, the flagship was successfully carry forwarded by Dr. Karunasindhu Das who beside being a native of Lokepara Mahavidyalaya was the **Vice-Chancellor of Rabindra Bharati University**. The then Education Minister Sri Sudarshan Roy Choudhury led the foundation stone on 20th January, 2011. Dr. Gangadhar Ghosh, being the first Principal of this college, poured his relentless efforts to strengthen the infrastructure of this institution during its nurturing days.*

*The college is affiliated to **The University of Burdwan and offers Honours in Bengali, History, Sanskrit and Philosophy and general course in Arts**. Over the short span since the establishment of the college, there has been a substantial enrollment of students from far and nearby to college education. 

Central Library




The library is the hub of learning for any educational institution. The history of Lokepara Mahavidyalaya library dates back to 2012. Due to the shortage of rooms, the administrative office had to accommodate the library for several years. It had then only four almirahs and few hundred books, mostly on Bengali literature and on History. In 2022, a separate room is allotted to the library. Right now, the library has a collection of 3111 books which includes several rare books donated by late *Anukul Shil*, a retired guest teacher of Political Science of Lokepara Mahavidyalaya.

The library has a reading space at the corner of the library room. Newspapers- both English and Bengali-are available for students. Several magazines, such as *Economic and Political Weekly*, *Ebong Mushaera*, *Yojana* etc cater to the need of aspiring students.



Dr. NABAKISHORE HAZRA MEMORIAL MUSEUM



The foundation of the Dr. Nabakishore Hazra Memorial Museum was laid in 2019. The initiative was spearheaded by the History Department, which emphasized on creating a specialized section dedicated to skill-based courses on museums and archives, heritage, art and architecture, popular culture, ethnographic practices, archaeology, and more. Recognizing the students' keen interest and passion for the museum, the institution chose to expand its scope, making it a unique feature. This brief overview will outline the key considerations made to guarantee the museum's relevance.



Four walls of the rectangular-shaped museum room have numerical marks in sequence. They are dedicated to four separate themes. The display of Wall-I has been constituted by four canvases that outline glimpses of prehistoric human civilization. All four are sketched by the students of this institution under the supervision of the History department. The upper part of the horizontally



bifurcated Canvas -1 demonstrates the evolution of human body structure while lower part emphasized on the evolution of human skull.



Canvas 2 and 3 elaborate the lithic culture. Students attempted to capture the stone tools from upper Upper Palaeolithic to the age of Microliths by dividing the two canvases into different blocks. The fourth one attempted to recreate sights of Mesolithic paintings of Bhimbetka cave art.

Regional Sculptural Excellence found way on Wall-2. A portion of the wall has three ranks (Rack 1, 2 & 3) where some replicas of archaeological findings across Bengal are placed. The larger part of this wall encompasses a photo gallery on the sculptural heritage of Bengal.



Wall-3 is preserved specifically for the art and craft of the Birbhum district, which have sought to become a specimen of the unique environment, social rituals, and historical narratives and achievements associated with this region. Racks 4,5,6, 7 and 9 have dedicated displays for Shola Pith art work, hand made models of Gala, bamboo work, wood carvings, and dry straw-made objects produced by local artisans. The wall also has two copper string made potrays.



Rack 8 is meant for displaying Ser Pai or Suri Bowls which are sophisticated measuring bowls, a unique creation of Lokepur village in Birbhum District, West Bengal. This craft dates back more than hundred years and is noted in General O'Malley's Birbhum District Gazetteer (1910). The word 'Ser' refers to a weight unit, and 'Poa' or 'Pi' means a quarter. These circular wooden bowls are decorated with brass designs, featuring motifs like fish, flower and lotus etc. The craft has been passed down within one family, the Karmakar family, who still make them today.

The artistic

statement of the land continues on Wall 4 where different signature features of weaving tradition and textile art have found space through the exhibition of Batik work, Kantha stitch, embroidered hand held fans



etc. with this, there is a 'Dhaner Gang', that not only considered as a symbol of good fortune for the households ,but also as a naturally stunning work of art that can serve as a decorative piece in rural homes. Besides, the wall has three exclusive collections of original manuscript from segments of Mangalkavyas which truly act as a tangible connection to our shared human legacy.




There is an iron rack, which helps to accommodate a few more exhibits. It has miscellaneous items such as a few replicas to demonstrate the North Indian sculptural tradition of different periods and old stone-made utensils, which were used by rural families for centuries to enhance food flavour, maintain heat, and provide natural, non-toxic cooking. books on art archaeology, cultural practices and photo albums of the Bengal school of art are also there to enhance students' knowledge about the art and antiquity of Bengal.

This museum is primarily created as a teaching museum to foster critical thinking, creativity, and deeper engagement, serving as active learning environments that improve knowledge retention beyond textbooks. The entire collection is obtained either through purchases, collections or generous donations. The regular visit of students from different departments under the guidance of their teachers is the key inspiration for this museum.

Note : In addition to the Major subject applied in a 3yr. /4yr. Bachelors Programme, a student has to choose Minor subjects, Multidisciplinary Subjects, Skill Enhancement Course, Ability Enhancement Course, Value Added Course and Vocational Course. These subjects and courses can be chosen by the student on the basis of availability of the subjects and courses in the college only after taking admission. Induction Programmes will be periodically held after admission to orient the students about these subjects and courses.

Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (CCFUP) as per NEP, 2020

One of the Transformative Initiatives in Higher Education Undergraduate Degree Programmes of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple entry and exit points and re-entry options, with appropriate certifications such as:

- a UG Certificate after completing 1 year (2 Semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study,
- a UG Diploma after 2 years (4 Semesters) of study,
- a Bachelor's Degree after a 3-year (6 Semesters) programme of study,
- a Bachelor's Degree (Honours) after a 4-year (8 Semesters) programme of study. If the students complete a rigorous research project/ dissertation in their major area(s) of study in the 4th year of a bachelor's degree then (Honours with Research).

A semester comprises 90 working days and an academic year is divided into two semesters.

A summer term is for eight weeks during summer vacation. Internship/ apprenticeship/ work-based vocational education and training can be carried out during the summer term, especially by students who wish to exit after two semesters or four semesters of study. Regular courses may also be offered during the summer on a fast-track mode to enable students to do additional courses or complete backlogs in coursework. The HEIs can decide on the courses to be offered in the summer term depending on the availability of faculty and the number of students.

Under the visionary leadership of Mamata Banerjee, Hon'ble Chief Minister, West Bengal, The Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal through the West Bengal State Council of Higher Education has introduced *Centralised Admission Portal* from 2024-2025 academic session considering the need for uniformity and transparency in the admission system in all Colleges and Universities throughout the state. Admission to the Undergraduate Courses in 17 Universities and 460 Government and Government-aided Colleges/ Higher Educational Institutions (HEIs) will be conducted through this portal.

The Centralised Admission Portal is a single window for admission to UG Courses/Programmes across HEIs of the state of West Bengal. This manual is a step-by-step guidance to the students who will apply through this portal in the Undergraduate Courses in HEIs of the State of West Bengal.
